A. SECTION 202, RA No. 10863 (CMTA)

(e) Facilitation and security of international trade and commerce through an informed compliance

Functions of the Bureau.— The Bureau shall exercise the following duties and functions:

B. DECENTRALIZATION OF CUSTOMS ACCREDITATION

Renewal of Customs brokers accreditation will be handled by the District offices

Customs issued CMO No. 19-2019 to make the accreditation process easier.

The Order allows importers to submit their renewal application at the nearest Collection District.

B. DECENTRALIZATION OF CUSTOMS ACCREDITATION

CPRS activation of entities accredited by other government agencies will be handled by the District offices

The same CMO allows Customs District offices to activate the **CPRS** of entities accredited by other government agencies upon receiving the proper endorsement from these offices.

EO No. 172 "Declaring Port of Batangas and Subic Bay **Freeport as Extensions of** the Port of Manila (MICT/ South Harbor) during Port Congestion"

Memorandum by Commissioner Guerrero dated 12 February 2019 "Transfer of **Empty Containers** to Port of Batangas and to **Subic Bay** Freeport as **Extension Ports of** POM and MICP" reiterates **Executive Order** 172.

CMO 13-2019 entitled "Interim Guidelines on the **Return of Empty Containers at the Port of** Manila (POM) and Manila International Container Port (MICP)"

CMO 13-2019 which addresses the issues that Customs stakeholders has raised on the return of **Empty** Containers was signed on February 28, 2019.
